## Farewell Mr Felts

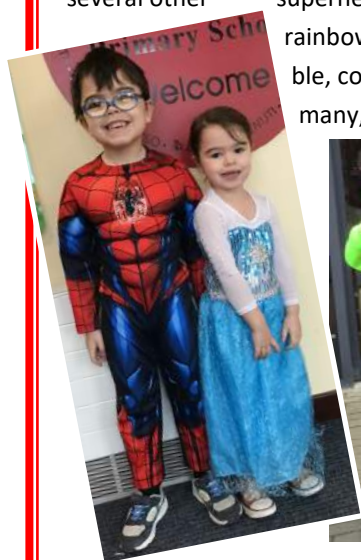


We are very sad to have to say goodbye to our wonderful Site Manager, Mr Felts. We wish him all the best in his new role—he will be very much missed.
