We will use a number of strategies to close the gap between our pupils including (but not limited to):

- Employing an additional teacher to 'team teach' within a classroom
- Employing an additional teacher to deliver high quality intervention and catch-up programmes
- Using a NTP company to delivering smaller group and 1:1 lessons
- Deliver high quality CPD for staff to improve first-wave teaching
- Engage with HfL initiatives such as Back on Track
- Purchase curriculum programmes, such as Back on Track Maths, to closely matched missed content to current curriculum expectations
- Provide opportunities to catch-up specific missed learning and pastoral opportunities
