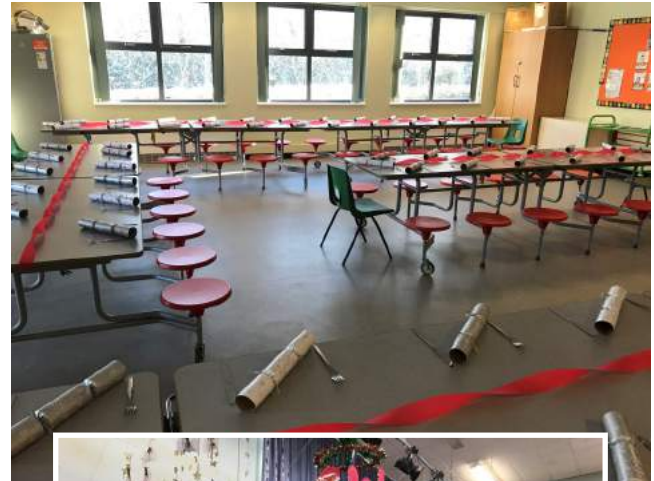
Tulip and Daisy Class worked incredibly hard to put on two amazing, and very moving, performances of their Christmas play.
