## Year 4 Science Workshop


Year 4's topic was States of Matter, learning about the differences between solids, liquids and gases. They melted chocolate and candles to change solids into liquids, and watched the chemical reaction between vinegar and bicarbonate of soda which created a gas to power a rocket.

Year 6 explored different forms of electricity, building a battery powered car, creating circuits to make a buzz wire game and using solar energy to power a fan.

This term all classes in Years 1-6 have had the chance to visit Stortford Gymnastics for the day.







Years 3-6 took part in a series of Air Quality Workshops funded by East Herts District Council and entered a competition to design a poster about all they had learnt—these are the winning entries!



## Year 3 Science Workshop

Year 3 had a brilliant time learning all about rocks in their Science Workshop.

They started the day by classifying rocks by their characteristics then moved on to explore how sedimentary rocks are formed using water and sand.

They then made their own fossils using plaster, made their own "metamorphic" rocks using wax to help understand how the process worked, then ended the day with some explosions that represented how igneous rocks are formed!





Year 5 explored Forces and Motion in their Science Workshop. They ran multiple experiments investigating water resistance and friction, and made their own parachutes to test air resistance.
