<u>Our Topic's</u> Spring 1: Will you read me a story? Spring 2: Amazing animals!

<u>Phonics</u>

During phonics time we will continue practising, general sound discrimination, body percussion, rhythm and rhyme, alliteration, voice sounds and oral blending and segmenting. As well as this we will start to learn how to correctly pronounce sounds, how to form the letters and look and listen for the letters in words. We will be starting with s,a,t,p,i,n in the first half of term.

<u>Maths</u>

This term children will be deepening their understanding of the numbers 1-10. They will count aloud and recite numbers to 10 and beyond. We will continue to practise counting with correspondence within 5 and then within 10. Children will experiment with their own symbols and marks as numerals.




Literacy, understanding of the world, communication and language and expressive arts and design.
